From the Vice Commodore

I have never been prouder to be a member of any club or organization than Fayerweather YC after the events which took place Sunday February 20th. I left the dock at FYC aboard Ken Newlands boat about noon to help with R/C for the Ideal 18's. It was a nice sunny day with 12 to 17 knots of breeze out of the Northwest. We got the races under way a little after 1 p.m. and all was well until the fourth leg of the third race. I saw Chris Gill signaling for assistance. Ken got on the radio and called to the whaler to render assistance and our Commodore George called 911. We had thought that Russell Dunleavy had fallen overboard at first because we couldn't see him on the boat. Chris Anto and my wife Betsy sailed over to the boat while the whaler was seconds away. Russell hadn't fallen overboard but much worse, he had a heart attack. Betsy, who is an RN, jumped onboard and did CPR. The whaler arrived and Russell was transferred by Chris, Betsy, and Greg Wykoff. Greg and Betsy continued CPR while Charlie Gulotta kept a cool hand at the helm and motored to FYC at full throttle. Arriving at the dock Russell was blue with no pulse. Waiting at the FYC dock were Mike Sullivan and Tom Lee with the FYC defibrillator. They got his heart going. The ambulance arrived and transported Russell to Bridgeport Hospital. Betsy went along in the ambulance while Tom Lee followed. The rest of us waited to hear how he was doing. A few hours later we got a call from Betsy letting us know that Russell was stabilized. As I write this article our friend Russell is being evaluated for a quadruple bypass. The doctors told my wife that Russell was alive because of the quick response and the CPR that was started immediately. There were several angels on the water on this day. Angels who are members of FYC and BRYC. I thank all of you who were involved for a valiant and heroic effort to save a friend.

Fleet Captain’s Corner

Club boats were discussed last month and this issue we conclude that portion of rules pertaining to the use of our skiffs and all Whaler-type vessels we own.

Rule Five: Club boats are for use in Black Rock Harbor only, except for official Club functions. All must be returned to the dock promptly after use. No Club boat may be left tied to a private mooring or dock.

Rule Six: Family members, guests and repairmen may use the launch provided the member notifies the dock person in charge in writing.

Rule Seven: Dock personnel will designate times when only two persons per moored boat will be dropped off or picked up by launch, based on traffic and weather conditions.

Thus we conclude our Dock and Club boat Rules... there are two or three that really require additional reinforcement. We will do a cursory review of these more important rules next month.

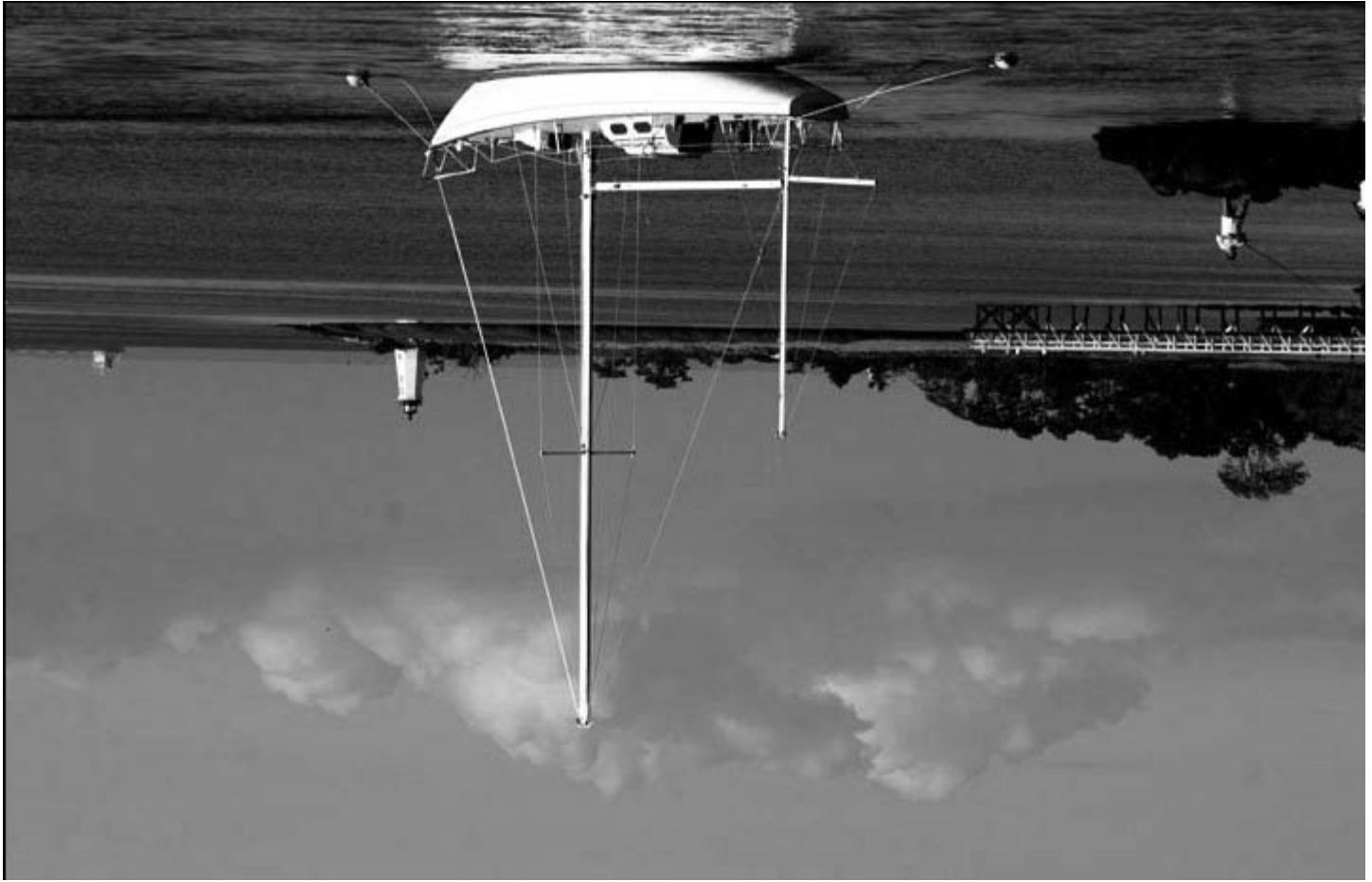
